Tampa Bay Watch Wins Two Golden Mangrove Awards

PROJECTS FUNDED BY TARPON TAGS

Tampa Bay Watch was recently honored with two Golden Mangrove awards for excellence from the Tampa Bay Estuary Program (TBEP) for our Vertical Oyster Garden and Little Bird Key projects funded by Bay Mini-Grants.

The first project involved the installation of 500 Vertical Oyster Gardens or at the docks of the Gulfport Marina in 2019 to create a hard substrate

where juvenile oysters can attach and develop. VOGs are oyster shells strung onto rope which are suspended from docks. The project's goals are to train volunteers to be long-term "stewards of the bay" and to help clean the water. This project was so successful that it is being adopted by our partners in Manatee County!

In the second winning project

we worked alongside the Friends of the TBNWR to install 500 oyster reef balls on the island which is part of the Pinellas National Wildlife Refuge. Little Bird Key is adjacent to the main channel of Boca Ciega Bay where boat traffic has caused



changes in currents and erosion. The reef balls were installed along the shoreline to assist with erosion control, provide habitat for marine life including beneficial oysters to assist in water quality, protect and increase mangrove habitat for avian nesters, and protect the nearby seagrass beds of the bay.

Both of these projects were supported by TBEP Bay Mini-Grants which are entirely funded by sales from the Tampa Bay Estuary specialty license plate. Next time you renew your vehicle registration consider purchasing a Tarpon Tag! You will directly fund environmental restoration and education projects right here in Tampa Bay.



Did you know...

Mangroves are an important protective nursery habitat. Their roots offer shelter to fish and other creatures until these juvenile animals are large enough to avoid most predators. Mangroves also provide protection from storms, clean our water, and even capture carbon dioxide from the atmosphere.

LENGTH: 15-30 inches

IDENTIFICATION: Adults can be gray, grayish-olive, brown, tan, or rusty orange, with variable patterns of dark stripes or bands down the body.

HABITAT: Commonly found along the coast in brackish and saltwater estuaries, salt marshes, and tidal mud flats.


Sponsored by Sheila and John Auer, the 240-gallon terrapin exhibit is home to Bertha and Ruby, two rare Ornate Diamondback Terrapins, classified as vulnerable species.

The exhibit teaches you all about terrapins and what makes them different from turtles and tortoises. The diamondback terrapin is the only turtle in the U.S. that inhabits estuaries, tidal creeks, and salt marshes where the salinity often comes close to that of the ocean. It thrives in estuaries like Tampa Bay where it can dine on crabs, snails, shrimp, fish, mussels, clams and other crustaceans.
