2020 Restoration

Program accomplishments



Oyster shell bars

Improving water quality by reducing shoreline erosion and promoting oyster habitats.

89 volunteers placed **72** tons of fossilized shell to form **4,104** square feet of new reef.



Oyster reef balls

Stabilizing shorelines, hard bottom habitats for wildlife, better water quality

320 volunteers built **625** reef balls and placed **500** reef balls in Tampa Bay.



Coastal Cleanups

Protecting wildlife and people from trash and marine debris that floats onto shorelines

219 volunteers removed **1,449** pounds of debris from shorelines and inland areas.



Great Bay Scallop Search

Where community joins together to record the status of the bay scallop population.

158 volunteers recorded **133** bay scallops in upper and lower Tampa Bay.



Fishing Line Recycling

Helping protect wildlife from unnecessary injury or death; line is collected for recycling.

59 volunteers removed **826** miles of fishing line and recycled **127** miles of line from **208** monotubes in **75** locations.



Native Plantings

Strengthening healthy shorelines to withstand effects of storms and provide essential habitat.

13 volunteers planted **6,700** plugs of native grasses to restore **9,529** square feet of habitat.



Clearing Marine Debris from our Waters

*Even during a pandemic,
marine debris program
yielded results*

Despite 2020 being a difficult year, our monofilament recycling program had great results since it can be accomplished with single volunteers. Tampa Bay Watch maintained 208 monotubes (monofilament recycling stations) at 75 docks, piers, and parks around the bay. 59 volunteers collected and retrieved 826 miles of fishing line from the monotubes throughout Pinellas, Hillsborough, Manatee, and Pasco Counties. 127 lbs. of monofilament was recycled.

Additionally our Do-it-Yourself (DIY) Neighborhood Cleanups proved to be a perfect way to participate in projects during the pandemic. Our annual summer cleanup and International Coastal Cleanup/National Estuaries Day Cleanup in the fall were successfully conducted in this format. It's amazing to see what we can do, even while socially distanced to work towards a cleaner future!

Program accomplishments



Summer Camps

Day camps give kids the opportunity to explore the bay by snorkel, kayak, and boat.

40 campers attended **25** days of camp—**three** of whom attended based on scholarship grants.



Bay Grasses in Classes

School-based native plant nursery program growing native plants.

1,050 middle and high school students from **14** participating schools raised and transplanted **1,112** plugs of native grasses to restore **6,098** square feet of habitat.



Field Trips

Where kids enjoy personal experiences with bay restoration, water quality, and the estuary.

823 students attended **54** field trips, along with **137** educators.



iSeahorse

A database for monitoring global seahorse populations and conservation efforts.

In collaboration with Project Seahorse and iNaturalist, **58** students and **8** educators caught, measured, and released **20** seahorses.



Florida Microplastic Awareness Project

Supported by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

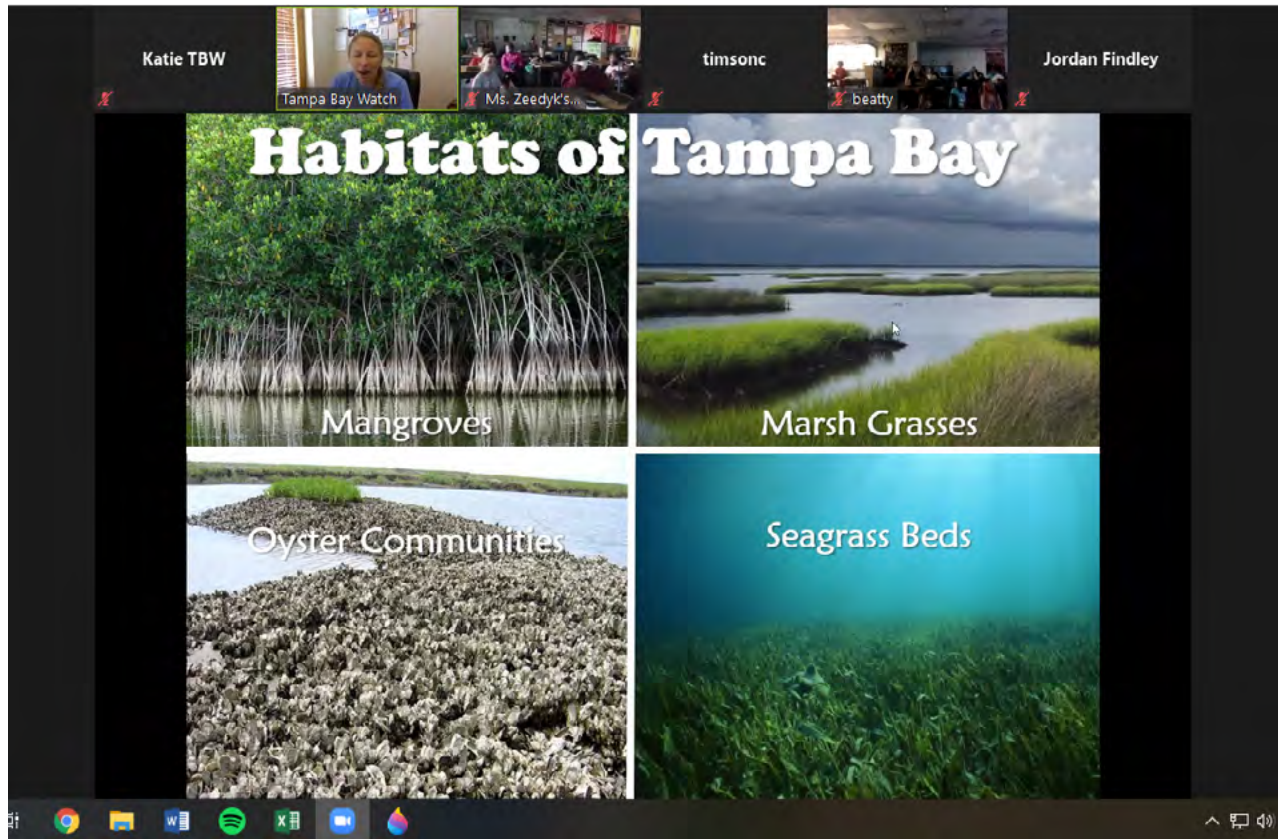
21 volunteers and **31** students gathered **4** litter samples, contributing data to the project.



Ocean Conservancy International Coastal Cleanup

70 community volunteers walked **49** miles to remove **579** pounds of debris throughout the Tampa Bay region.



New Tricks of the Trade

Education efforts go online during 2020

Education is a vital part of our mission at Tampa Bay Watch. We offer education programs that introduce estuarine ecology and habitat restoration through hands-on school field trips. Our education department was proactive in the continuance of our programs during this unprecedented time since public school field trips were not permitted for the 2020 school year. In response to these policy changes, our educators found it necessary to strategically modify our programs to better meet the needs of the community during these times through the development of traveling education kits.

Our education kits contain programmatic educational materials, resources, and lesson plans that can be delivered to schools to replace our on-site field trips and outreach visits. These kits include a combination of lesson plans and materials for hands-on activities, marine science labs, student-led experiments, and data science projects, adhering to Florida State Standards. The curricula is designed to be facilitated by the teacher or guided by Tampa Bay Watch staff virtually. The goal is to increase students' understanding of the function and importance of the coastal and marine habitats in the absence of field trips.

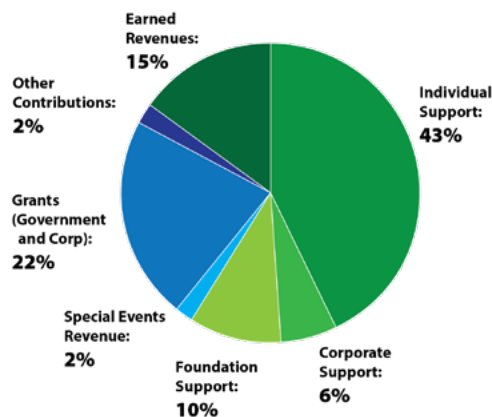

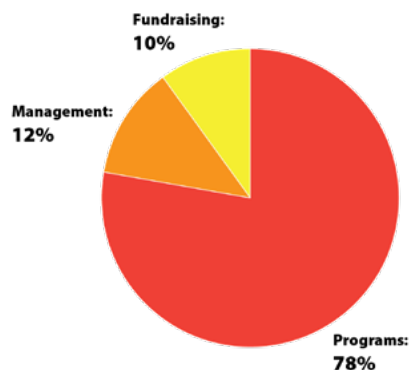


Financial Snapshot
