# **GENEROUS SUPPORT BRINGS NEW FACILITY NAME**

~ TIERRA VERDE MARINE EDUCATION **CENTER BECOMES AUER MARINE EDUCATION CENTER** 

#### ~ NEW TERRAPIN EXHIBIT AT THE **DISCOVERY CENTER**

Tampa Bay Watch is thrilled to announce that the Auer Family has generously funded the program and building improvements to the Tampa Bay Watch education center in Tierra Verde. The building currently named Tampa Bay Watch Marine Education Center will now be known as "Auer Marine Education Center." The Marine Education Center is the base for the established Estuary EDventures educational program.

The funding provided by the Auer Family will help Estuary EDventures continue to enhance and evolve the program's reach and capacity, provide resources to run existing programming and staff, and also allow the creation of new **STEM and Citizen Science programming** and curriculum for both on-site and off-site participants. This critical support will allow Estuary EDventures to continue offering free and reduced-cost programming to Title I and academically at-risk schools and community members, which currently accounts for more than 50% of Estuary EDventures programming.

The Auer Family's donation will also provide resources to help with the upkeep, management, and enhancement of the 2500 sq. ft. educational classroom space that includes observation tanks, including Palm—our resident animal







ambassador, which is an ornate diamondback terrapin—as well as the outdoor wet lab and collective 10,000-gallon open-air observation tanks, as well as our 32-foot Beach Cat classroom vessel, all of which are critical components to the success of the Estuary EDventures programming.

In addition to the enhancements to our education building and programs, the Auer Family also has funded a **new terrapin exhibit** at the Tampa Bay Watch Discovery Center on the St. Pete Pier.

Starting in May, our new floating classroom will be launched from the Tampa Bay Watch Discovery Center.

Moored at the St. Pete Pier, The Discovery, a 45'-foot USCG-certified catamaran, will provide on-the-water school field trips in the mornings and will be utilized for familyfriendly public ecotours in the afternoons.

Tours and activities will include a fisheries trawl, bird

spotting and species traits identification, and dolphin and manatee identification and behavior education all while enjoying a relaxing cruise on Tampa Bay.

### **BUILDING OYSTER REEFS**

With the help of community volunteers, Tampa Bay Watch crew installed 265 oyster reef balls and 110 feet of oyster shell reef in March and April along the shoreline of Whiskey Stump Key in Hillsborough Bay.

The oyster reef will assist in stabilizing the shoreline, providing hard substrate for oysters to colonize, and

providing habitat for fish and wildlife.

This multi-year project will be wrapped up in May with an additional oyster shell bar installation.


