# Letter from the President

## Out of the pandemic: a new normal, a renewed vision

This year Tampa Bay Watch adjusted to the “new normal” post-pandemic and pressed forward with our habitat restoration and environmental education initiatives. Unfortunately, the bay area continued to see negative effects from the Piney Point environmental disaster which happened last year. Excessive nutrients in the bay resulted in macro algae blooms in the summer and through the winter months, but thankfully the water quality didn’t prevent our summer campers from getting in the water. We were excited to host a record thirty-one boats in Tarpon Rodeo and hold the annual Great Bay Scallop Search for the first time in person in three years.

The Tampa Bay community dodged a bullet in October and were minimally affected by catastrophic Hurricane Ian, with the exception of Manatee County being affected by heavy winds and flooding. Although Red Tide crept into our area later in the year as a result of the storm with excessive nutrients in the bay.

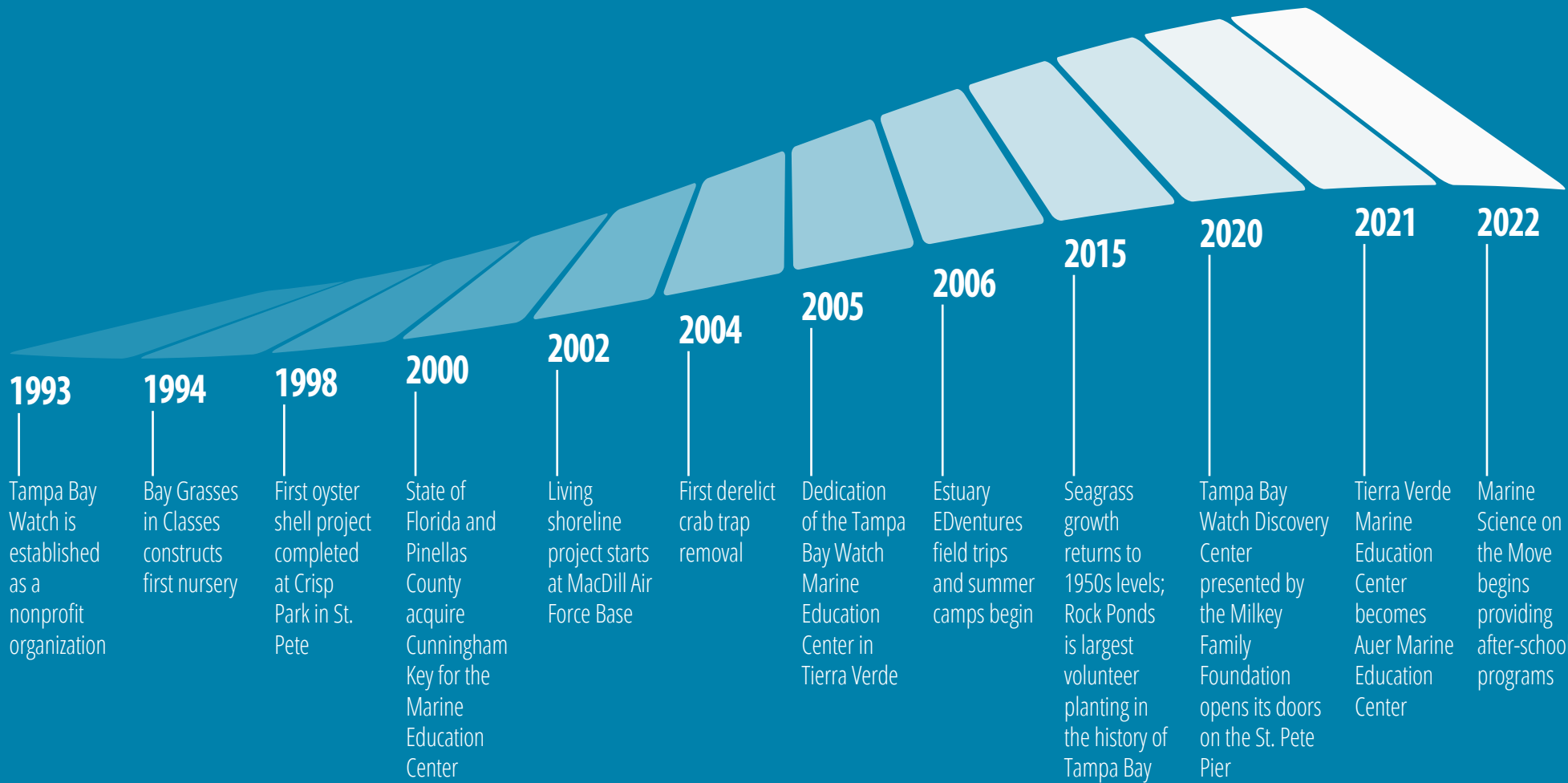
Community-based restoration activities of Tampa Bay Watch play a significant role in maintaining water quality and buffering Red Tide blooms. Controlling our fertilizer use, cleaning up after our pets and installing Florida friendly plants all play a role in reducing nutrients and supporting water quality and habitat goals in Tampa Bay. And above all we must educate and involve our children. They will inherit the bay we leave them — and face a growing challenge to mitigate the effects of continued water quality issues, red tide, and an anticipated rise in sea level, all of which will affect the health of Tampa Bay.

Now more than ever, we need your help to invest in the protection and restoration of Tampa Bay in order to prevent further deterioration. Each volunteer, member, partner, and sponsor play a key role in the important work that we do at Tampa Bay Watch. Thank you all!

# Strategic Plan Goal Update

Our organization strived to make progress in the first year of our 2022-2026 strategic plan with a goal to enact impactful change in support of the organization, our community and the environment. The intent of this plan is to take Tampa Bay Watch to the next level of growth, addressing needs and infrastructure to ensure it will be an environmental mainstay for many generations to come. Here are some achievements for each of our strategic goals:

## Restoring a Healthy Tampa Bay

**The restoration team launched a successful pilot year** of a new Oyster Shell Recycling program which resulted in 49,087 lbs. of shell recycled in 2022 from Island Grille and Raw Bar, The Oyster Bar, Morgan Mae's Oyster House! The recycled oyster shell is used to create vertical oyster gardens—structures suspended from docks to create a hard substrate to which juvenile oysters can attach. The shells will also create oyster shell bars to restore lost habitat systems to the bay, prevent further erosion of the shoreline and improve water quality through natural biological filtration.

## Engaging and Immersive Educational Programs

**Generous funding from the Shields Foundation and St. Petersburg Rotary** allowed the Tampa Bay Watch Discovery Center to expand after-school offerings with the launch Marine Science on the Move, a mobile education program that delivers hands-on programs to local students. Recognizing resources for field trip experiences and transportation to an off-site facility may be limited to many teachers, Tampa Bay Watch educators are addressing the need by providing meaningful marine science education directly to the region's classrooms.

## Engaging and Immersive Educational Programs (cont'd)

**Education team** returned to pre-pandemic staffing, moved away from virtual programs, and returned to in-person field trips and summer camp programs.

**Expanded our reach to the under-served community** by hosting 32 programs for Title I and academically at-risk schools at no cost to the school itself.

## Community outreach, stewardship, and volunteer engagement

**New members joined our Corporate Membership program** in 2022:

# Restoration and Earth Week

We commemorated Earth Day this year with an opportunity for the community to build a living shoreline at our multi-year project at Lassing Park, in partnership with the City of St. Pete.

55 volunteers shoveled 10 tons of shell to create approximately 200 square feet of reef, deployed 97 oyster reef balls, and planted 2,000 smooth cordgrass plugs.

Overall, the project is designed to help stabilize approximately 700 feet of severely eroding shoreline.

During avian migration season, Lassing Park is a feeding ground and rest stop for many species of shorebirds, including the federally threatened Red Knot.



Lassing Park is one of the few remaining undeveloped shorelines in St. Petersburg. It has been part of the St. Pete park system since 1924! But over time, the shoreline of Lassing

Park has seen severe erosion due to decades of impacts from large wind-driven waves and wake from passing boats and ships. The park is also bordered to the north and south by hardened concrete shorelines that amplify the intensity of waves and wakes hitting the shoreline.

Creation of a living shoreline project, including oyster reef balls, oyster shell reefs, and coastal wetland plants will prevent further erosion of Lassing Park, restore lost habitat systems to the bay, and improve water quality through natural biological filtration.



## Flooded with Generosity

Our sincerest thanks to Neptune Flood for awarding us with a grant to support our oyster habitat program.

Neptune is committed to protecting the environment and giving back to our community. Their team has already started volunteering on restoration projects throughout Tampa Bay!

Headquartered in downtown St. Petersburg, Neptune's CEO Trevor Burgess stated, "Tampa Bay Watch was a natural fit to receive our first grant of \$50,000. We look forward to our partnership and making a difference for current and future generations of bay neighbors."



# Restoration by the Numbers



## Oyster Shell Bars

Improving water quality, reducing shoreline erosion, and promoting oyster habitats. **466** volunteers created oyster reefs with **129** tons of fossilized oyster shell.



## Oyster Reef Balls

Stabilizing shorelines, building hard-bottom habitats for wildlife, enhancing water quality. **956** volunteers created **1,140** oyster reef balls and installed **695** reef balls in Tampa Bay.



## Coastal Cleanups

Protecting wildlife and people from trash and marine debris that floats onto shorelines. **154** volunteers collected **2,754** pounds of debris.



## Native Plantings

Strengthening healthy shorelines to withstand effects of storms and provide essential habitat. **13,720** plants installed by **234** volunteers to restore **13,740** square feet of shoreline.



## Fishing Line Recycling

Helping protect wildlife from unnecessary injury or death by collecting and recycling monofilament fishing line. **630** miles of fishing line recovered and recycled from **217** monotubes.



## Great Bay Scallop Search

Monitoring and documenting the health and status of the bay scallop population. **112** volunteers counted **167** scallops which were widespread throughout Boca Ciega Bay.



## Lightning Community Hero!

Katie Mastenbrook, Tampa Bay Watch Director of Education, received the Lightning Community Hero award on April 4, 2022. This signature philanthropic initiative of the Tampa Bay Lightning Foundation honors local heroes who make positive impacts on their community through good works and volunteerism.

Katie received a \$50,000 grant from the Lightning Foundation and the Lightning Community Heroes program, presented by Jabil, which will solely support our Estuary EDventures program at the Auer Marine Education Center in Tierra Verde.

# Lightning Community Foundation

Tampa Bay Watch used the generous funding from the Lightning Foundation to support the strategic expansion of the Auer Marine Education Center in Tierra Verde through curriculum development and the renovation of our wet lab to expand the capacity of our programs. The remodel provides a more dynamic and interactive teaching space and new field trip programs centered on the remodel. The creation of new teaching space in our outdoor wet lab included a new paved area, additional picnic tables for student seating, and a brand-new heater and chiller for a 4,000-gallon observation saltwater tank. We are modifying existing tanks to provide an oyster biodiversity holding tank and lab. We envision this lab tying together our organizational restoration efforts throughout the bay with the oyster population, and bringing it to life in a hands-on lab format where students can be scientists for the day. Additionally, the Lightning funds allowed



Estuary EDventures to facilitate 53 meaningful environmental hands-on field trips to a total of 1,250 bay area students, teachers, and chaperones. Estuary EDventures field trips include immersive hands-on activities ranging from our classroom boat otter trawl activity, seining, and squid dissection lab as examples. All field trip experiences connect students with the importance of the Tampa Bay estuary in their daily lives, the biodiversity of the animals and habitats within the estuary, as well as giving them an opportunity to participate in a hands-on field experience utilizing scientific tools and techniques.

We thank the Lightning Community Foundation for the opportunity to build upon our mission of fostering a healthy Tampa Bay watershed through community-driven restoration projects, education programs, and outreach initiatives.



# Education by the Numbers



## Field Trips

The Auer Marine Education Center & Discovery Center engaged **1,927** local school children on **122** immersive field trips.



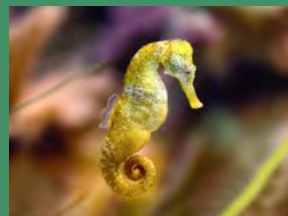
## Summer Camps

**291** campers had the best summer ever at **35** days of camp at the Auer Marine Education Center and Discovery Center.



## Bay Grasses in Classes

School-based native plant nursery program growing native plants. **7,600** plants installed by **700** students to restore **14,009** square feet of shoreline.



## iSeahorse

A database for monitoring global seahorse populations and conservation efforts. Students identified **87** seahorses.



## Earth Echo

**147** students collected local water samples and contributed their findings to Earth Echo's database monitoring the health of the world's oceans.



## Florida Microplastics Awareness Project

Supported by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). Students were educated in FMAP program and submitted **807** water samples.

# Overcoming Transportation Challenges: Marine Science on the Move

Arranging transportation for field trips is an ongoing challenge for teachers in our region. School bus availability is limited and the cost to hire a private company is high. In 2022, the Discovery Center launched Marine Science on the Move to remove this barrier. With our new mobile education initiative, we bring meaningful lessons directly to local students at schools, partner organizations, and community outreach events via van.

Led by Zoe Caraffi, the Discovery Center's Education Coordinator, our educators have designed a set of transportable programs that offer engaging activities, labs, and interactions with live animal ambassadors. "Our goal is to recreate the excitement and value of a traditional field trip experience, but make it accessible to a much larger audience," said Caraffi.

A first-of-its-kind, iPad-based virtual lionfish dissection introduces participants to fish

anatomy and physiology and the threats posed by invasive species. Herpetology 101 and Estuary Encounters bring learners face-to-face with species from the Discovery Center's animal collection. The response from teachers has been positive, and we are working with them to create additional lessons aligned with classroom goals.

While Marine Science on the Move visits are available to any class or group that wants to participate, our priority is to serve Title I schools and underserved communities in the Tampa Bay region. Looking ahead, strong partnerships with educational institutions and fellow nonprofits will lead to the expansion of this initiative and the opportunity to inspire thousands of future leaders to connect with and protect Tampa Bay. Our sincerest thanks to Shields Family Foundation and the Rotary Club of St. Petersburg for leading funding for this amazing program!





# Discovery Center

The Discovery Center's unique location on the St. Pete Pier provides a platform to share educational exhibits and experiences with visitors from our community and around the world. Guests can explore our exhibit gallery, participate in a sustainable dissection, or take an eco tour led by knowledgeable educators. Our reach will continue to expand as we add new programs and partnerships designed to inspire good stewardship of Tampa Bay.

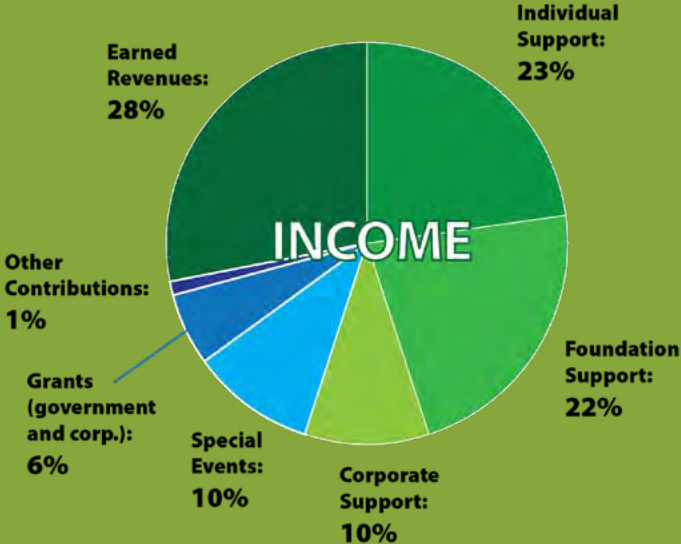
